The Role of the Assistant (ages 18 months to 6 years) – Certificate Course

This Assistant's course prepares the adult to work in early years classrooms for children ages 18 months to 6 years. This two part course consists of academic contact hours and a practicum.

The program combines in-class coursework, delivered by experienced instructors and professionals in the field, and a two-week practicum under the direction of the Montessori educator, plus four observations in a Montessori school.

Early Childhood (2 ½ through 6) Diploma Program – Summer Mode, Part-time, Full-time

Elementary I & II (6 through 12) Diploma Program – Summer Mode, Full-time
