


Classroom Management is a Collective Noun

Classroom management is a collective noun. It is comprised of multiple tasks that work together to contribute to a successful classroom. Reading books or listening to lectures does not result in a mastery of classroom management. Just as in our lessons, success is based on scaffolding skills, experience and application.

TMI students begin gathering and developing their classroom management tools in the lab school through observation, recess duty, daily supervised practice with children, practicum placements, and participation in school activities. Each experience is debriefed and discussed within the context of the different strands of classroom management.



TMI students are part of a learning community where they are mentored by experts including our classroom management panelists, field supervisors, administrators and mentor teachers. Each shares their expertise, experience and expectations of managing a Montessori classroom with Grace and Courtesy.

As TMI students become more aware of the elements of classroom management, they recognize the need for their active participation in their own development as a professional, which continues throughout their career.

Certificate and Diploma Programs

Starting July 2018

- **The Role of the Assistant (ages 18 months to 6 years) – Certificate Course**

This Assistant's course prepares the adult to work in early years classrooms for children ages 18 months to 6 years. This two part course consists of academic contact hours and a practicum.

The program combines in-class coursework, delivered by experienced instructors and professionals in the field, and a two-week practicum under the direction of the Montessori educator, plus four observations in a Montessori school.
